



Frozen Mittens Child

Size: 4 – 6 years (5.5 inches)

Supplies:

- Fingering weight yarn – Blue – 150 yards (about 32 grams) White – 80 yards (about 18 grams)(I used Knit Picks Palette in Cyan and White)
- Four size 1 (2.25 mm) double-pointed needles (or size needed to get gauge)
- Stitch markers
- Scrap fingering weight yarn
- Tapestry needle

Gauge: 10 stitches and 12 rows per inch

Abbreviations:

- K – knit
- P – purl
- M1 – make one, direction doesn't matter
- M1r – make one right
- M1l – make one left
- Ssk – slip, slip, knit
- K2tog – knit two stitches together

Follow the written pattern for shaping instructions and the chart for the color pattern. Switch which side of the pattern you do first to make the opposite hand.

Cuff:

Cast on 56 stitches. Divide between three needles. Join together to knit in the round being careful not to twist the stitches. Place a stitch marker between the last and first stitch to mark rows.

Row 1 -12: k1, p1 until end of row

Row 13 – 26: k

Hand:

Row 27: k19, m1, k18, m1, k19, m1 (59 stitches)

Row 28: k29, m1l, k1, m1r, k29 (61 stitches) (You may want to place stitch markers before the m1l and after the m1r to help mark the thumb gusset.)

Row 29: k

Row 30: k29, m1l, k3, m1r, k29 (63 stitches)

Row 31: k
 Row 32: k29, m1l, k5, m1r, k29 (65 stitches)
 Row 33: k
 Row 34: k29, m1l, k7, m1r, k29 (67 stitches)
 Row 35: k
 Row 36: k29, m1l, k9, m1r, k29 (69 stitches)
 Row 37: k
 Row 38: k29, m1l, k11, m1r, k29 (71 stitches)
 Row 39: k
 Row 40: k29, m1l, k13, m1r, k29 (73 stitches)
 Row 41: k
 Row 42: k29, m1l, k15, m1r, k29 (75 stitches)
 Row 43 - 44: k
 Row 45: k29, m1l, k17, m1r, k29 (77 stitches)
 Row 46 - 47: k
 Row 48: k29, m1l, k19, m1r, k29 (79 stitches)
 Row 49 - 50: k
 Row 51: k29, m1l, k21, m1r, k29 (81 stitches)
 Row 52- 53: k
 Row 54: k29, put the next 23 stitches on a piece of scrap yarn, cast on one stitch, k29 (59 stitches on the needles, 23 on the yarn)
 Row 55: k28, k2tog, k29 (58 stitches)
 Row 56 – 77: k
 Row 78: ssk, k25, k2tog, ssk, k25, k2tog (54 stitches)
 Row 79: k
 Row 80: ssk, k23, k2tog, ssk, k23, k2tog (50 stitches)
 Row 81: k
 Row 82: ssk, k21, k2tog, ssk, k21, k2tog (46 stitches)
 Row 83: k
 Row 84: ssk, k19, k2tog, ssk, k19, k2tog (42 stitches)
 Row 85: k
 Row 86: ssk, k17, k2tog, ssk, k17, k2tog (38 stitches)
 Row 87: k
 Row 88: ssk, k15, k2tog, ssk, k15, k2tog (34 stitches)
 Row 89: ssk, k13, k2tog, ssk, k13, k2tog (30 stitches)
 Row 90: ssk, k11, k2tog, ssk, k11, k2tog (26 stitches)
 Row 91: ssk, k9, k2tog, ssk, k9, k2tog (22 stitches)
 Row 92: ssk, k7, k2tog, ssk, k7, k2tog (18 stitches)

Cut the yarn leaving about a 12” tail. Put the front stitches on one needle and the back on another. Seam the top of the mitten with the Kitchener stitch.

Thumb:

Put the 23 stitches on the scrap yarn on three needles. Pick up two stitches from the hand and place a stitch marker after them to mark rows. 25 stitches on the needles.

Row 54: k23, k2tog (24 stitches)
 Row 55 – 67: k
 Row 68: ssk, k8, k2tog, ssk, k8, k2tog (20 stitches)
 Row 69: k

Row 70: ssk, k6, k2tog, ssk, k6, k2tog (16 stitches)

Row 71: k

Row 72: ssk, k4, k2tog, ssk, k4, k2tog (12 stitches)

Row 73: ssk, k2, k2tog, ssk, k2, k2tog (8 stitches)

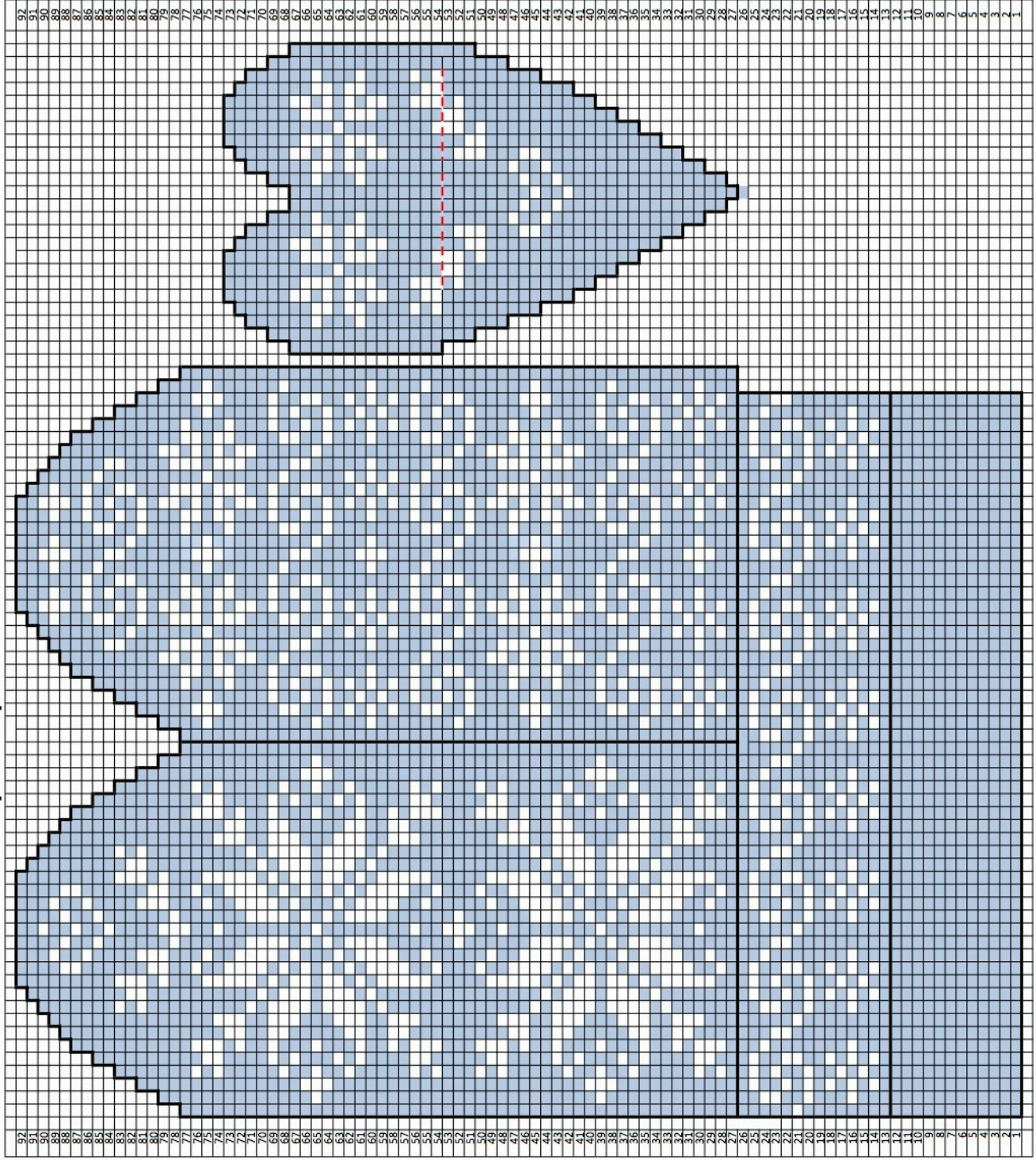
Cut the yarn leaving about a 12" tail. Put the front stitches on one needle and the back on another. Seam the top of the mitten with the Kitchener stitch.

Weave in all ends.

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
