

Austria Mittens

Supplies:

- 40 grams (about 200 yards) Fingering yarn
- 20 grams (about 110 yards) Contrasting fingering yarn (I used hand painted yarn)
- Four size 1 double-pointed needles (or size needed to get gauge)
 - Stitch marker
 - Scrap fingering yarn
 - Tapestry needle

Gauge: 10 stitches and 12 rows per inch (gauge is important to get the stated size)

Size: Woman's Medium (7.5" around and 7.5" long, from row 37 to top with a 3" cuff)

Abbreviations:

k – knit

p – purl

m1 – make 1 stitch (direction doesn't matter)

ssk - slip, slip, knit

k2tog - knit two stitches together

Follow the written pattern for shaping and the chart of color changes

Cuff:

Cast on 72 stitches with contrasting yarn. Divide between 3 needles. Join together to knit in the round, placing a stitch marker between the first and last stitch to mark rows.

Row 1: (with background yarn) k

Row 2 - 22: (k1, p1) until end of row

Row 23 - 36: k

Hand:

Row 37: k36, m1, k36, m1 (74 stitches)

Row 38 - 68: k

Row 69: (right hand) k5, k the next 15 stitches onto the scrap yarn, move those 15 stitches back to the left needle, k54.

Row 69: (left hand) k16, k the next 15 stitches on to scrap yarn, move those 15 stitches back to the left
needle, k58
Row 70 - 108: k
Row 109: ssk, k33, k2tog, ssk, k33, k2tog (70 stitches)
Row: 110: k
Row 111: ssk, k31, k2tog, ssk, k31, k2tog (66 stitches)
Row 112: k
Row 113: ssk, k29, k2tog, ssk, k29, k2tog (62 stitches)
Row 114: k
Row 115: ssk, k27, k2tog, ssk, k27, k2tog (58 stitches)
Row 116: ssk, k25, k2tog, ssk, k25, k2tog (54 stitches)
Row 117: ssk, k23, k2tog, ssk, k23, k2tog (50 stitches)
Row 118: ssk, k21, k2tog, ssk, k21, k2tog (46 stitches)
Row 119: ssk, k19, k2tog, ssk, k19 k2tog (42 stitches)
Row 120: ssk, k17, k2tog, ssk, k17, k2tog (38 stitches)
Row 121: ssk, k15, k2tog, ssk, k15, k2tog (34 stitches)
Row 122: ssk, k13, k2tog, ssk, k13, k2tog (30 stitches)
Row 123: ssk. k11. k2tog. ssk. k11. k2tog (26 stitches)
Row 124: ssk, k9, k2tog, ssk, k9, k2tog (22 stitches)
Row 125: ssk, k7, k2tog, ssk, k7, k2tog (18 stitches)
Row 126: ssk, k5, k2tog, ssk, k5, k2tog (14 stitches)
```

Put the first 7 stitches on one needle and the second 7 on another. Cut the yarn leaving about a 12" tail. Seam the top using Kitchener stitch.

Thumb: (On row 69, I pick up two stitches at each side of the thumb and then knit them together on row 70 to help prevent holes. You can also just pick up one stitch and skip the k2togs on row 70 if you wish. The extra picked up stitch is not shown on the color chart.)

Carefully remove the scrap yarn putting the bottom stitches on one needle and the top stitches on another. Fifteen stitches on each needle. Now divide the stitches between three needles placing a stitch marker to mark rows between the top and bottom stitches on the right side.

Row 69: k15, pick up and knit 2 stitches from the hand of the mitten, k15, pick up and knit 2 stitches from the hand of the mitten, (34 stitches)

```
Row 70: k15, k2tog, k15, k2tog (32 stitches)
```

Row 71 – 99: k

Row 100: ssk, k11, k2tog, k1, ssk, k11, k2tog, k1 (28 stitches)

Row 101: ssk, k9, k2tog, k1, ssk, k9, k2tog, k1 (24 stitches)

Row 102: ssk, k7, k2tog, k1, ssk, k7, k2tog, k1 (20 stitches)

Row 103: ssk, k5, k2tog, k1, ssk, k5, k2tog, k1 (16 stitches)


Row 104: ssk, k3, k2tog, k1, ssk, k3, k2tog, k1 (12 stitches)

Put the first 6 stitches on one needle and the second 6 on another. Cut the yarn leaving about a 10" tail. Seam using Kitchener stitch.

Weave in ends.
