

Sweater Girl by Kathy Lewinski

Made to fit a 2" Girl Darice Doll Pin

Gauge: 15 stitches and 17 rows per inch (It is important to get gauge to get the stated size.)

Supplies:

- Three colors of scrap lace weight yarn
- Four size 0000 double-pointed needles or size needed to get gauge
- Stitch maker
- Tapestry needle

Abbreviations:

k – knit

p - purl

k2tog – knit two stitches together

Follow the written pattern for shaping and the chart for color work.

Body:

Cast on 46 stitches. Divide between three needles and join together to knit in the round. Place a stitch marker between the first and last stitch to mark rows.

Row 1 – 2: [k, p] until end of row

Row 3: k

Row 4: k2tog, k21, k2tog, k21 (44 stitches)

Row 5 – 6: k

Row 7: k9, k2tog, k20, k2tog, k11 (42 stitches)

Row 8 – 9: k

Row 10: k2tog, k19, k2tog, k19 (40 stitches)

Row 11 -12: k

Row 13: k8, k2tog, k18, k2tog, k10 (38 stitches)

Row 14 – 15: k

Row 16: k2tog, k17, k2tog, k17 (36 stitches)

Row 17 – 18: k

Row 19: k2tog, k32, k2tog (34 stitches)

Row 20 – 21: k

Row 22: k2tog, k30, k2tog (32 stitches)

Row 23 – 24: k

Row 25: k2tog, k28, k2tog (30 stitches)

Row 26: [k3, k2tog]6x (24 stitches)

Bind off. Weave in all the ends except the bind of tail.

Sleeves:

Cast on 6 stitches.

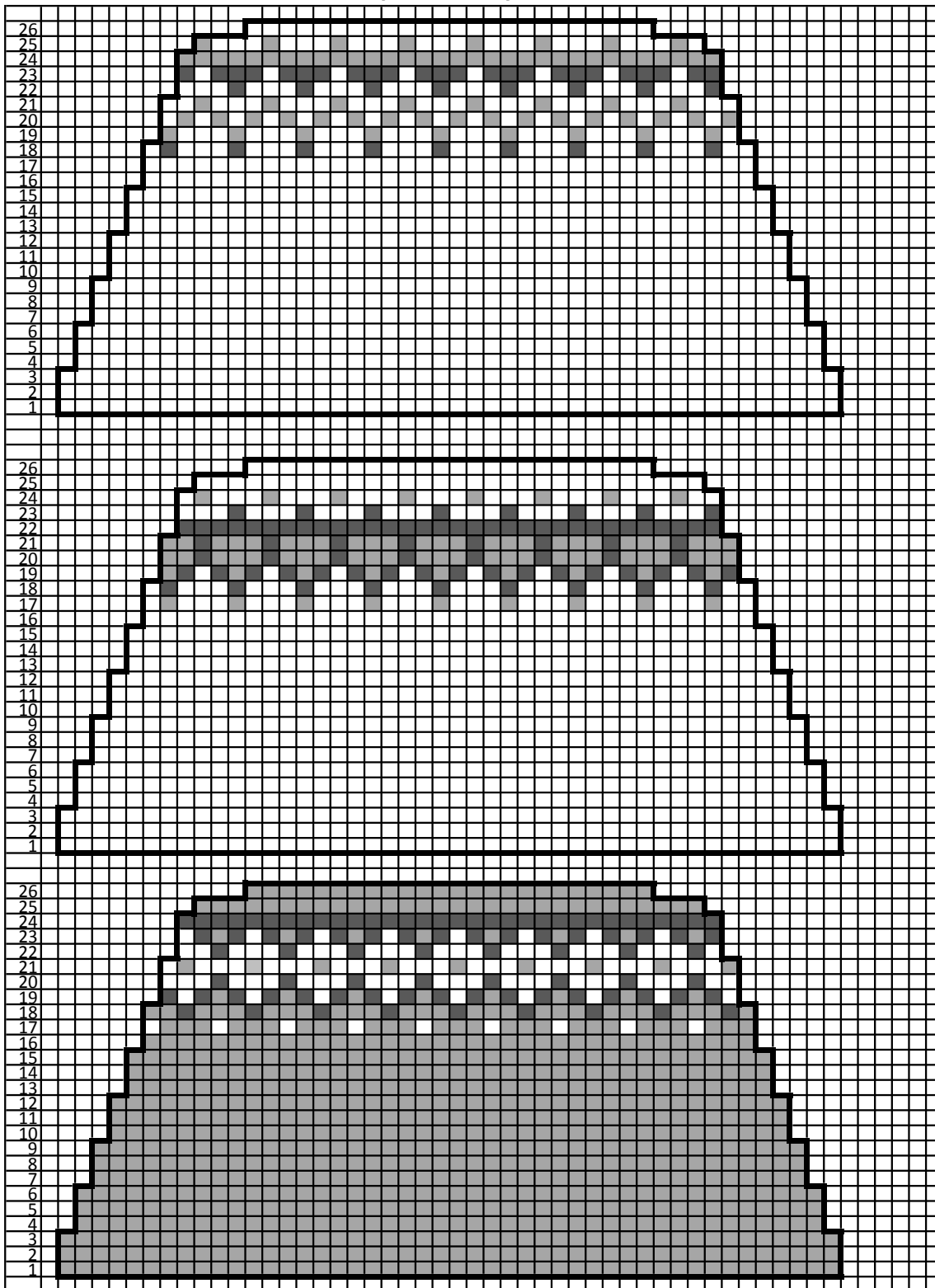
You are going to work these stitches as an i-cord, but don't worry about pulling it into a tight tube when you slide it over and start knitting the new end. The side with the loose stitches will be the one you glue to the sweater.

Knit 7 rows. Cut the yarn and weave the tail through the stitches on the needle. Pull tight. Leave the tails to attach to the body later.

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
