



Wee Fair Isle Mitten

I have worked this mitten in four colors, but you can easily use one color in the place I used two different blues.

Size: 2.5" (6.35cm) tall x 1.5" (3.8cm) wide wee size when knit at gauge. Tiny size is about 60% bigger

Supplies:

- 1 set size 1US (2.25mm) double-pointed needles
- Approx. 3g/5yds Knit Picks Palette (100% Peruvian Highland Wool 50g/231yds) or similar fingering weight yarn in four colors (MC (Marble Heather) 1.5g/7.5yds, CC1 (Blue) .5g/2.5yds, CC2 (White) .5g/2.5yds, CC3 (Sky) .5g/2.5yds) Approx. 60% more for the tiny size.
- Scrap fingering yarn
- Stitch marker
- Tapestry needle

Gauge: 10 stitches and 12 rows per inch in stranded color work in the round

Abbreviations:

- K – knit
- K2tog – knit two together
- M1l – make 1 left
- M1r – make one right
- P – purl
- Rnd(s) – Round(s)
- Ssk – slip, slip, knit
- Sts – stitches

Wee Size:

Cuff:

With MC, cast on 22 sts. Divide between three needles. Join together to knit in the round being careful not to twist stitches. Place a stitch marker between the last and first stitch to mark the beginning of the rounds.

Rnd 1: p

Rnds 2 – 5: k following color work pattern starting on rnd 5.

Thumb Gusset: You will be working the thumb gusset between the make ones. Make sure to follow the thumb chart for the color work.

Rnd 6: k11, m1, k11 (23 sts)

Rnd 7: k11, m1r, k1, m1l, k11 (25 sts)

Rnd 8: k

Rnd 9: k11, m1r, k3, m1l, k11 (27 sts)

Rnd 10: k
Rnd 11: k11, m1r, k5, m1l, k11 (29 sts)
Rnd 12: k
Rnd 13: k11, m1r, k7, m1l, k11 (31 sts)
Rnd 14: k
Rnd 15: k11, m1r, k9, m1l, k11 (33 sts)
Rnd 16: k
Rnd 17: k11, place 11 sts on a piece of scrap yarn, k11 (22 sts on the needles, 11 sts on scrap yarn)

Finish Hand:

Rnds 18 – 24: k
Rnd 25: ssk, k7, k2tog, ssk, k7, k2tog (18 sts)
Rnd 26: k
Rnd 27: ssk, k5, k2tog, ssk, k5, k2tog (14 sts)
Rnd 28: ssk, k3, 2tog, ssk, k3, k2tog (10 sts)
Rnd 29: ssk, k1, k2tog, ssk, k1, k2tog (6 sts)

Either seam the top with Kitchener stitch or weave the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

Finish Thumb:

Divide the 11 sts on the scrap yarn between three needles.

Rnd 17: k11, pick up and knit a stitch from the hand (You may want to pick up 2 sts and knit them together to prevent a hole.) (12 sts)
Rnds: 18 – 19: k
Rnd 20: ssk, k2, k2tog, ssk, k2, k2tog (8 sts)
Rnd 21: k
Rnd 22: ssk, k2tog, ssk, k2tog (4 sts)

Either seam the top with Kitchener stitch or weave the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

Weave in ends. Block.

Tiny Size:

Cuff:

With MC, cast on 34 sts. Divide between three needles. Join together to knit in the round being careful not to twist stitches. Place a stitch marker between the last and first stitch to mark the beginning of the rounds.

Rnds 1 - 2: p
Rnds 3 – 8: k following color work pattern starting on rnd 8.

Thumb Gusset: You will be working the thumb gusset between the make ones. Make sure to follow the thumb chart for the color work.

Rnd 9: k17, m1, k17 (35 sts)
Rnd 10: k17, m1r, k1, m1l, k17 (37 sts)
Rnd 11: k

Rnd 12: k17, m1r, k3, m1l, k17 (39 sts)
Rnd 13: k
Rnd 14: k17, m1r, k5, m1l, k17 (41 sts)
Rnd 15: k
Rnd 16: k17, m1r, k7, m1l, k17 (43 sts)
Rnd 17: k
Rnd 18: k17, m1r, k9, m1l, k17 (45 sts)
Rnd 19: k
Rnd 20: k17, m1r, k11, m1l, k17 (47 sts)
Rnd 21: k
Rnd 22: k17, m1r, k13, m1l, k17 (49 sts)
Rnd 23: k
Rnd 24: k17, m1r, k15, m1l, k17 (51 sts)
Rnd 25: k17, place 17 sts on a piece of scrap yarn, k17 (34 sts on the needles, 17 sts on scrap yarn)

Finish Hand:

Rnds 26 – 34: k
Rnd 35: ssk, k13, k2tog, ssk, k13, k2tog (30 sts)
Rnd 36: k
Rnd 37: ssk, k11, k2tog, ssk, k11, k2tog (26 sts)
Rnd 38: k
Rnd 39: ssk, k9, k2tog, ssk, k9, k2tog (22 sts)
Rnd 40: ssk, k7, k2tog, ssk, k7, k2tog (18 sts)
Rnd 41: ssk, k5, k2tog, ssk, k5, k2tog (14 sts)
Rnd 42: ssk, k3, k2tog, ssk, k3, k2tog (10 sts)

Either seam the top with Kitchener stitch or weave the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

Finish Thumb:

Divide the 17 sts on the scrap yarn between three needles.

Rnd 25: k17, pick up and knit a stitch from the hand (You may want to pick up 2 sts and knit them together to prevent a hole.) (18 sts)
Rnds: 26 – 30: k
Rnd 31: ssk, k5, k2tog, ssk, k5, k2tog (14 sts)
Rnd 32: ssk, k3, k2tog, ssk, k3, k2tog (10 sts)
Rnd 33: ssk, k1, k2tog, ssk, k1, k2tog (6 sts)

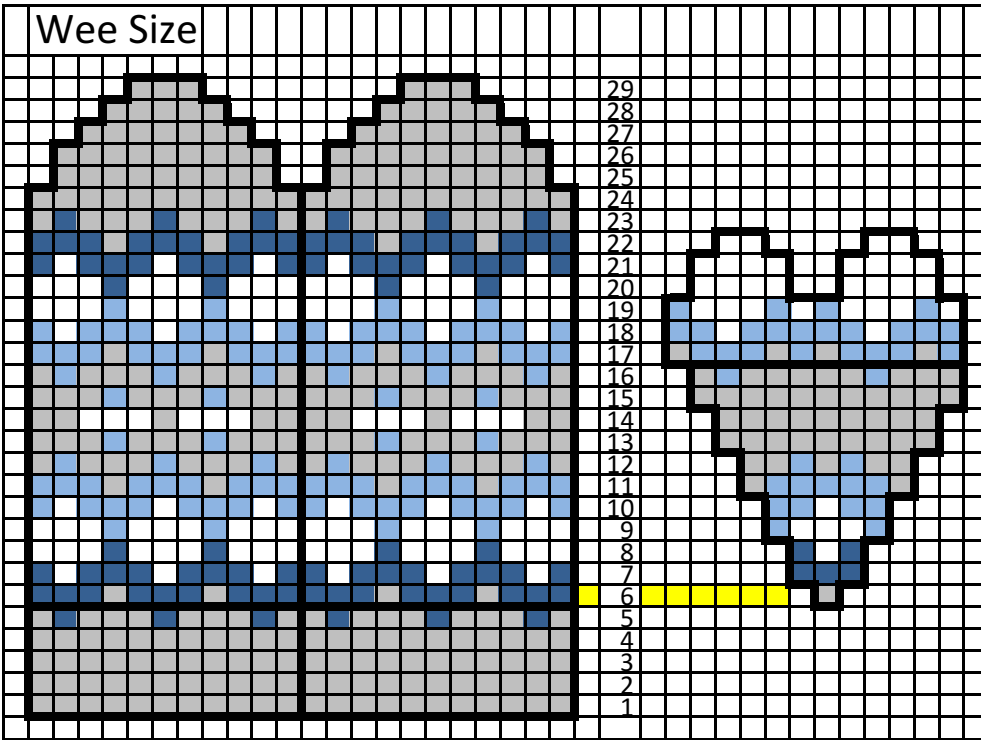
Either seam the top with Kitchener stitch or weave the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

Weave in ends. Block.
